TERMINOLOGY TO KNOW

	Major/Program - Umbrella for everything in the degree, must be approved by THEC
	Concentration - A specialized area of study within the major that appears on transcripts, does not need THEC approval, only notification
	Tracks - Less formal specializations that do not appear on transcripts, which can be helpful to determine if something should become a concentration, does not need THEC approval or notification
	QUESTIONS TO DISCUSS
	Do you have the students to support the major?
	Consider accreditation demands, employment & scholarship trends
	Do you have buy in from key players, including faculty, leadership, and community partners?
	Do you have sufficient resources, including faculty lines and facilities?
	Do you have a plan to market the new major?
	How will this change affect other concentrations?
	Do you have a core that goes through the whole program?
OTHER CONSIDERATIONS	
	Consider prefix and course numbers carefully, these are difficult to change
	Credit hour changes are also difficult to make
	Consider if any courses need inactivated, if it is in the catalog, students expect it to be taught
